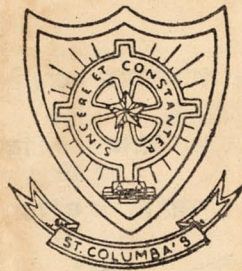

## GENERAL RULES

1. On class days and at School functions boys must wear the uniform prescribed for the season. Boys must come to school clean and tidy.
2. Boys must be in their respective classrooms at least five minutes before the time fixed for classes to commence.
3. Boys who come late or who have been absent on the previous day, must bring an explanation from the parents countersigned by the Principal.
4. Irregular attendance, habitual idleness, neglect of homework, disobedience and disrespect towards teachers, and members of the Staff, or bad moral influence justify dismissal. Pupils are responsible to the School Authorities for their conduct both in and outside School.
5. Boys are strictly forbidden to introduce objectionable literature into the School or to purchase any article of food from unauthorised dealers at or near the School premises.
6. During the absence of the teacher from the class boys must obey the Monitor appointed to maintain good order.
7. Any kind of damage done to the School premises must be made good.
8. Parents are expected to co-operate in the work of the School by enforcing regularity and discipline and by taking general interest in their children's progress. They should check the Diary regularly and note the teachers remarks, etc.
9. Except in case of illness, pupils will not be granted leave outside the regular vacation periods. Pupils who do not join School promptly after vacations are liable to forfeit their places.
10. The Annual Examination for promotion is held each year in December. Pupils who fail in this



examination will on no account be promoted. Pupils who fail twice in the same class will not be permitted to continue their studies in this School.

11. No pupil will be allowed to sit for the Annual Examination, if his School fees have not been paid in full up to December inclusive.
12. Special arrangements cannot be made for pupils who from any cause, are absent from any of the Tests. Answer papers submitted by the pupils in their Tests, will not under any circumstances be returned to their parents or private tutors.
13. The managers, acting through the Principal, reserve the right of resigning, at once, the charge of any pupil who, for any reason, is deemed unsatisfactory. In such cases the Principal does not bind himself to give any reason.
14. A pupil who has been suffering from or who has been in contact with any infectious disease must produce a special certificate to the effect that he can attend School without risk of conveying infection.
15. Provision is made for sports and athletics. Pupils must attend games in the evening when required to do so, unless exemption has been granted on a written application from their parents. Parents should not apply for such exemption without good cause, because sports and games are an important part of a boy's all-round education.
16. Pupils may be required to take part in such cultural activities as : Dramatics, Music, Singing, etc., particularly when School functions are being arranged. Participation in such functions will be deemed compulsory by the School Authorities.
17. Previous to the withdrawal of a pupil from the School, a month's notice must be given in writing, otherwise a month's fees will be charged.

## FEES AND RULES FOR PAYMENT

### K. G. and Classes 1, 2, 3

Rs. 348/- if paid in lump sum before 28th February  
Or six instalments of Rs. 60.00 each.

### Classes 4, 5, 6

Rs. 405/- if paid in lump sum before 28th February  
Or six instalments of Rs. 70.00 each.

### Classes 7, 8, 9, 10, 11

Rs. 460/- if paid in lump sum before 28th February  
Or six instalments of Rs. 80.00 each.

- Note :*
- (i) An instalment is payable for each two-month period, as follows : on or before 7th of February, April, June, August, October, November.
  - (ii) An examination fee of Rs. 3/- for Classes 3 to 5 and Rs 5/- for Classes 6 to 10 is payable before 7th November. This amount should be added to the sixth instalment and paid at the same time.
  - (iii) If all fees for the year, including the examination fee, are not paid by 7th November no boy may be permitted to appear for his final or annual examination. If payment is made after 7th November there will be a charge of Rs. 10/- as late fee. In all such cases this late fee must be paid.
  - (iv) Admission fee : Rs. 10/-.
  - (v) School Magazine : Rs. 10/-.

The School will issue a series of six pay-in-slips with a special B. B. number. This B. B. number will vary from year to year. These slips will be given to your son (s) on or before 25th January or may be collected from the School office



after that date. Your B. B. number for this year should be carefully noted. The School does not issue any other bills for the payment of fees.

If fees fall into arrears a boy's name may be struck off the School Rolls and readmission may not be granted.

*Note*: No School business will be done during the holidays.

### BUS CHARGES

1. January and February : Rs. 30/- to be paid before 25th January.
2. March and April : Rs. 30/- to be paid before 15th March.
3. July, August, September : Rs. 45/- to be paid before 15th July.
4. October and November : Rs. 30/- to be paid before 15th October.
5. No bus charges for May, June, December.

Each boy must have his bank receipt with him daily. A month's notice in writing is to be given if the boy is to discontinue using the bus. If a boy discontinues using the bus before the expiry of the period for which he has paid, there will be no refund.

The School will issue a series of four blue pay-in-slips with a separate B. B. number (not the same B. B. number as for fee payment).
